#### **HOW IS THIS ACCOMPLISHED?**

The mission of the Avilas is fulfilled through weekly Holy Hours as members pray for an increase of vocations to the vowed, religious, and ordained priesthood; they also pray for the perseverance for those who have already consecrated their lives to God.

### WHY?

St. Teresa, foundress of the Discalced Carmelites, was born in Avila, Spain, on March 28, 1515; she was named 'Doctor of the Church' by Pope Paul VI on September 27, 1970. Her special gift to the Church in our time is to teach us to pray, and to persevere in the conviction that prayer is the foundation for all apostolic work. Following in her spirit, Avilas are called by virtue of their membership in the family of God, to pray for those whom God calls to serve the Church in the vowed, religious and ordained ways of life.

Conscientious study of the vocation to vowed and ordained ways of life is necessary in order to understand it and explain to others

## There are two forms of membership in the Avilas

Active Avila Members commit themselves to make a Holy Hour once a week. Active members attend Mass, Holy Hour and luncheon meetings five (5) times a year and pay annual dues which include payment for luncheons. Active members receive the newsletter; have a voice in all actions of the organization, and assist the Diocesan Vocation Office when needed.



Sustaining Avila Members commit themselves to make a Holy Hour once a week. Sustaining members pay one-half the annual dues, attend luncheon meetings whenever possible (with a nominal charge for lunch), and will receive the newsletter. This level of membership is designed to make it possible for those who are unable to attend meetings for health or other reasons, but would still like to be a member of the Avila organization. Sustaining members do not enjoy voting privileges.
