#### The Holy Name of Jesus

#### HAPPY NEW YEAR!

After all the preparation, the Christmas Holidays are over (again). This is typically the time when many of us make New Year's resolutions. There are the old annual stand-by's: lose that pesky ten pounds that we've been trying to lose for years and start an exercise program, be more responsible with my finances, be nicer to my spouse or clean the closets (let's face it, the clothes we've been saving for when we lose weight are probably outdated anyway). The list of resolutions is endless, just like the excuses we make to not follow through with those we've made. What about our relationship with God in the new year? How's your prayer life? My guess is that most of us can improve. Don't set unrealistic goals for yourself, but here are some suggestions:

Fr. Larry Richards says, "No Bible, no breakfast. No Bible, no bed." Try to be in the Word daily.

- If you rise early, you can say the Rosary with Fr. Pacwa at 7:30 am on EWTN, then follow along with the Mass at 8 am. It's a good way to start the day and also to hear the daily readings. If you like to sleep in, be assured the Rosary is recited throughout the day, along with the Mass at noon and the Chaplet of Mercy later on.
- Try to attend Mass one or two days during the week in addition to your Sunday Mass obligation.
- Do some spiritual reading instead of reading the latest romance novel or the weekly "Enquirer." Wonderful daily meditations can be found in the "Magnificat" or in "In Conversation with God" just to name a few. If you have a Kindle, you can download many Catholic books for free or for a nominal price.
- Resolve to have a daily prayer time. If you don't already, start with 15 minutes. After a while, you'll realize how
  valuable this time is and that you will WANT to spend more one-on-one time with the Lord. Spend some time
  in silence to listen to what the Lord might be saying to you.
- Resolve to go to Confession at least once a month. Many graces await us there.
- As Avilas, we must not forget our weekly holy hour to pray for our Spiritual Sons or Daughters.

The great thing about our relationship with God is that we can always start fresh. He offers us a new day and a new dawn. Don't wait until you are perfect to come before the Lord. He loves us the way we are and wants us to be closer to Him. At the start of this new year, thank Him for 2017 and for all that happened, good or bad, ask His forgiveness in the areas that you have failed or fallen short, then dedicate 2018 to serving Him and loving Him more and more. Ask our Blessed Mother to help you. She always leads us to Her Son.

Lord, thank you for this new year. I am reminded that, by Your grace, each day is fresh and bursting with Your love and mercy. I want to begin with a clean slate. I know that you are always ready to forgive me. Help me to be forgive myself and to forgive others. Help me to live in the goodness that comes from doing Your will. Help me to put aside any anxiety I may have about the past and the future so that I can live in peace with You in the moment. May I be an inspiration and an example of Your love to all those I meet. Give me the strength to stand tall in the midst of conflict, to speak Your name even when I'm scared to do so and to choose faith over fear. I want to surrender anything that stands between us. May I always be drenched and engulfed in Your amazing love. Amen.

In the course of our busy days, we often take family and friends for granted and neglect to express our true feelings to them. Although Valentine's Day is very commercialized, we shouldn't let it pass us by, but rather use it as an opportunity to express our love and devotion to those we hold near and dear. Buy a card, cook a special dinner or give flowers or candy as a gesture of love and special affection. Whatever you do, don't forget to say, "I love you." But, our first love should really be Jesus.
