To Jesus Through Mary

Our patron, St. Teresa of Avila, had a great love for the Blessed Virgin Mary. The title of her Marian devotion was specifically Our Lady of Mount Carmel. We can imitate our patron and wear the Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel as a sign of our own love and devotion to the Mother of God. This can be an external sign of our consecration to the Blessed Mother's Immaculate Heart. To consecrate oneself to Mary is to choose, after the example of many saints of the Church, to belong to her in a special way to follow Jesus with her and through her. At the last apparition of Fatima, Our Lady appeared as Our Lady of Mt Carmel holding a Scapular in her outstretched hand. In the apparitions of Our Lady at Fatima, Our Lady requested us to pray the rosary. In this month of May, as we honor the Blessed Mother, let us remember what some other saints have told us:

"One day, through the Rosary and the Scapular, Our Lady will save the world." (Saint Dominic)

"The greatest method of praying is to pray the Rosary."

"For this is the month during which Christians, in their churches and their homes, offer the Virgin Mother more fervent and loving acts of homage and veneration; and it is the month in which a greater abundance of God's merciful gifts comes down to us from our Mother's throne."

How can we refuse God's special blessings in May? Do something special for Mary during the month of May:

- Make a May altar, make a crown of flowers for Mary and have a May crowning.
- Have more attentiveness and affection for Mary when reciting the Rosary, spread devotion to the Rosary and teach someone how to recite the Rosary.
- Share a Miraculous Medal with someone and tell them how special it is.
- Wear a Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel if you do not already do so.
- Read a book about Mary. Consider "The World's First Love: Mary, Mother of God" by Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen.
- Visit a church dedicated to Mary or perhaps a pilgrimage to one of Her shrines.
- Make little sacrifices in Mary's honor throughout the day.
- Offer small but frequent prayers of love to Mary during the course of each day, such as "Mary, my Mother,
 I love You" or "Mary, blessed be Your purity."
- Alternate reciting a Hail Mary and Hail Holy Queen each time the clock strikes the hour. Recite three Hail Mary's before going to sleep at night.
- Recite with great affection the Regina Caeli (until Pentecost) and the Angelus daily at noon.
- Do your ordinary work well in honor of Mary's life, remembering that she, too, kept house and cared for Jesus and Joseph.
- Say a kind word or offer a helping hand for someone in honor Mary's selflessness and joy in visiting her cousin, Elizabeth.
- Offer up some pain, discomfort or inconvenience in honor of the hours Mary spent in front of her son while He was dying on the cross.
- Recite a Memorare for the person in your family who needs it most.
- Smile in honor of Mary's humility when someone belittles us or corrects us.
- Make a consecration to Mary. Consider Fr. Michael Gaitley's "33 Days to Morning Glory."

As May was the month of Mary and June the month of the Sacred Heart and May leads into June, Mary leads us to love of her Son, symbolized by His Heart.

Be sure to do something extra special in honor of His Sacred Heart during the month of June:

- Jesus gives us His heart again and again, and we must give our hearts to Him in return.
 Consecrate yourself to the most Sacred Heart of Jesus this month. Consider using "Consoling the Heart of Jesus" by Fr. Michael Gaitley.
- Have your home enthroned to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- Make acts of reparation to the Sacred Heart for all the atrocities done against Him. Console His Heart by making Holy Hours in front of the Tabernacle.
- Offer small but frequent prayers of love to Jesus during the course of the day such as, "Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us" or "Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in Thee."
- Loving the Sacred Heart of Jesus means returning love for love, bringing His love to others, loving and forgiving our enemies and those who persecute us.
- Learn the 12 Promises of Jesus to those who venerate His Sacred Heart.
