
Jesus is never envious when we honor His Mother. On the contrary, He wills it, expressing it in the Fourth Commandment – “Honor thy father and mother” - and from the cross when he told John, “Behold thy mother” (John 19:27). Isn't the Blessed Virgin our Mother? Christ gave Her to us because He knew we needed a mother just like Her. Giving us an example in His own life, Jesus was a most loving Son and obedient to Mary (Luke 2:51). We are to imitate Him in every aspect of His life, and, through Jesus, we have that divine example of devotion to His Mother. We should never feel that we might be giving too much love to Her. We can never outmatch the love that Jesus had for His Mother. And Mary always leads us to love Her Son more and more

If you have not already done so, consider consecrating yourself to our Blessed Mother. You can do this by reading St. Louis-Marie de Montfort's book, “True Devotion to Mary” or by reading Fr. Michael Gaitley's book, “33 Days to Morning Glory.”

PRAYER TO ST. ANTHONY

O Holy St. Anthony, gentlest of Saints, your love for God
and charity for His creatures made you worthy when on earth
to possess miraculous powers. Encouraged by this thought,
I implore you to obtain for me (request). O gentle and loving St. Anthony,
whose heart was ever full of human sympathy,
whisper my petition into the ears of the sweet Infant Jesus,
who loved to be folded in your arms,
and the gratitude of my heart will ever be yours. Amen.



Saint Anthony was born Fernando Martins in 1195 in Lisbon, Portugal, into a wealthy family. At age 15, he asked to be sent to the Abbey of Santa Cruz, where he learned theology and Latin and was ultimately ordained to the priesthood. When Franciscan friars settled a small hermitage not too far from the Abbey dedicated to Saint Anthony of Egypt, Fernando eventually received permission to join the new Franciscan order, where he was admitted and changed his name to Anthony. He then traveled to Morocco to preach the Gospel, but became very ill and was sent to Portugal to recover, but the return voyage was blown off-course, the boat arrived in Sicily and the group traveled to Tuscany. Anthony was assigned to the hermitage of San Paolo due to his health, where he spent his time praying and studying while recovering. Sometime later, Dominican friars came to visit the Franciscans and there was confusion over who would give the homily. The Dominicans were known for their preaching, so the Franciscans assumed one of them would provide the homily, but the Dominicans assumed the Franciscans would provide one. The head of the Franciscan hermitage then asked Anthony to speak on whatever the Holy Spirit inspired him to. Despite his objection, Anthony gave an eloquent and moving homily that impressed both groups. News of his eloquence soon reached Francis of Assisi, and he found a friend in Anthony.

In 1224, Francis entrusted his friars' pursuits of studies to Anthony. Anthony had a book of psalms that contained notes and comments to help when teaching students and, in a time when a printing press was not yet invented, it was very valuable to him. When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole Anthony's valuable book. When he discovered it was missing, Anthony prayed it would be found or returned. The thief *did* return the book and returned to the Order as well. (The book is said to be preserved in the Franciscan friary in Bologna today.) Anthony occasionally taught at two universities in southern France, but he performed best as a preacher. Once, when he tried to preach the true Gospel of the Catholic Church to heretics who would not listen, he went out and preached his message to the fish, not for the instruction of the fish, of course, but rather for the glory of God, the delight of the angels and the easing of his own heart. When his critics saw the fish gathering, they realized it would probably be in their best interests to also listen to what Anthony had to say.

Anthony died in 1231 at only 35 years of age, and was canonized less than one year afterward by Pope Gregory IX. His body was found to be corrupted 336 years after his death, but miraculously his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it. Because his teaching of the Catholic Faith was so simple and resounding, the most simplest, unlettered and innocent could understand his messages. It is for this reason he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946. He is typically depicted with a book and holding the Infant Child Jesus in his arms, and is commonly referred to as the "finder of lost articles." St. Anthony is venerated all over the world as the Patron Saint for lost articles, and is credited with many miracles involving lost people, lost things and even lost spiritual goods. We all know someone who is "lost" in some way. Put that person under St. Anthony's protection and consider a nine week novena to him (nine Tuesdays) which are said at a number of parishes. His feast day is June 13.
